 SAIL held it's annual Emerging Leaders Conference from March 9-11 at Camp Spalding. First and second year students had an opportunity to learn about leadership skills and network with upperclass student leaders and EWU faculty/staff.

- SAIL partnered with ASEWU and Panhellenic Council to host entrepreneur and philanthropist Alex Sheen. Alex is the founder of *Because I Said I Would*, an international social movement dedicated to the making and keeping of promises. 153 students attended a luncheon and keynote event with Alex held on February 22.
- 130 students participated in 3 Service Saturday events hosted throughout winter quarter.

 Activities included making dog toys to donate to Spokanimal, spending time with senior citizens at Cheney Care Center, and making greeting cards to send to the local Shriner's Children's Hospital.
